

Rice Harvest Festival kicks off with annual parade

Families gathered early along Avenue C on Saturday morning, October 7th, to view the annual Rice Harvest Festival Parade, featuring decorated floats and vehicles — most with rice, historic, or Katy themes. Antique vehicles from the Johnny Nelson Museum led the way for parade participants, which included city officials, school groups, nonprofit

organizations, churches and area businesses. State Representative Jacy Jetton also participated, along with representatives from Harris County Precinct 4.

Starting this weekend, the Rice Harvest Festival — Katy's annual hometown celebration — features three days

Last year the Rice Harvest festival flew in a local Katy girl and her band to come home to perform. They have been invited back again this year and they will be performing again at this weekend's festival.


Mackenzie Bryce (Christiansen) is Katy born and bred — attending Katy Elementary

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Rain brings relief to area

Burn ban and drought contingency plan lifted

Recent rains have brought relief to the Katy area in more ways than one — with the lifting of drought restrictions for residents of the city of Katy and the lifting of the burn ban in Fort Bend County.

Effective October 4th, the City of Katy rescinded all stages of its drought contingency plan, according to a press release posted on the city's website. After meeting with ARKK Engineers and city officials, Mayor Dusty Thiele determined that all criteria had been met in order to deactivate the plan and to allow residents to return to normal non-drought water use conditions.



Suicide Awareness and Prevention Walk set for Oct. 14

Join the Suicide Awareness and Prevention Walk on Saturday, October 14, from 5 to 8 p.m. This event, which will be held at Rick Rice Park, located behind Crosspoint Church at 700 Westgreen Blvd., in Katy, aims to raise awareness about mental health and promote suicide prevention in the Katy community.

During the walk, participants can:

- Learn more about the warning signs of suicide
- Help spread awareness
- Honor a victim of suicide
- Find new ways to love yourself

"Together, we can make a difference and support those struggling," said event representative Megan Welch. "Participating in this walk will show your solidarity and commitment to creating a supportive environment for everyone."

Organizers say that suicide is the eleventh leading cause of death in America, with more than 1.7 million people attempting suicide each year.

The walk is partnering with Never Be Solo as they begin their tenth year in the journey to spread awareness and the story of their beloved son and brother, Stephano. They have built a community in California and Texas, sharing their knowledge of signs to look for in loved ones and sources of assistance. Stephano's family will be present to honor his legacy in this one-mile walk and community event.

Stone Creek Psychotherapy and Wellness Center will have therapists onsite to talk to anyone seeking counseling and information. Celebrating its 20th year in business, the center has helped countless clients deal with depression, anxiety, and other illnesses that could turn to suicidal ideation if they went untreated.

In honor and remembrance of those lost to suicide, organizers are posting photos of lost loved ones so that their memory can be honored at the walk. To include a photo of your loved one, please email the picture to admin@stonecreektherapy.com.

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

"We are asking all our citizens, businesses and HOAs to continue to use their best efforts to conserve water so we do not have to re-activate the Drought Contingency Plan," said Thiele in a statement.

Due to a decrease in high temperatures, an increase in rain, and a significant drop in points on the Keetch-Byram Drought Index (KBDI) over the past week, Fort Bend County Judge KP George has also rescinded the burn ban that Commiss-

sioner's Court imposed on August 8, 2023.

Effective, October 6, 2023, at 1:00 p.m., the Declaration and Order Prohibiting Outdoor Burning in Fort Bend County, Texas is canceled.

Under the recommendation of the Fort Bend County Fire Marshal, residents are advised to follow the guidelines of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for outdoor burning, which include the

following:

1. No fire can be left unattended
2. There must be some form of fire protection on-site, hose, fire extinguisher, shovels/rakes, bulldozer, etc.
3. No fire should be within 50 feet of a residence or structure

4. No burning at night
The KBDI index for Fort Bend County has dropped by 164 points with a continued forecast for more rain in the coming days.

plan for the downtown area. Parking, she said, was the missing piece.

Local business owner Tara Wilson, who owns The Hub co-working space on First Street as well as other buildings in downtown Katy, spoke of the importance of accessibility to downtown businesses.

Bill Bain, who owns KT Antiques and also owns several downtown properties, noted that "it is critical that we get this parking lot done." He said that he had maintained the lot at his own expense for several years because of its importance in getting customers through the doors of local businesses.

In other action, council:

- Unanimously approved the project plan and expansion of the boundaries of Reinvestment Zone Number One (TIRZ) in the area where the new Home Depot is being built on Kingsland Blvd.

- Voted unanimously to consider an ordinance appointing James Robert Davidson to the Keep Katy Beautiful board, filling a vacancy created by Kesley Moebes.

- Via consent agenda, canceled the council meetings scheduled for Nov. 27 and Dec. 25, due to the holiday schedule.

The next meeting of city council is scheduled for October 23rd at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall, 901 Avenue C in Katy.

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Historic Downtown Wharton



Where fatal accidents have occurred in Katy over the past five years

Reading about car accident statistics and insights specific to Katy can be unnerving. But understanding the locations of fatal car accidents and those intersections with a high number of wrecks can help increase your safety as you are more aware of your surroundings while driving. As technology evolves and roads become more congested, staying informed is crucial to keeping our community safe by reducing the number of accidents in Katy.

According to data from the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) there were no fatal accidents in 2018, one in 2019, one in 2020, two in 2021, and one in 2022. All car wrecks are difficult, but a collision where someone loses their life is devastating.

Let's explore exactly where those fatal accidents occurred in Katy.

1. Morton Ranch Road at Elrod Road. A six-year old boy and his 3-year old sister were killed at this intersection in 2019 in a wreck involving two vehicles. Investigators believe speed and possible difficulties with right-of-way may have been the primary factors.

2. 26000 block of Morton Road. A 29-year old male driver and his 13-year old male passenger were killed at this location in 2020 in a single-vehicle wreck. Investigators say the man was driving a Chrysler 300 at roughly 100 miles per hour when it lost control and traveled off the roadway. It then collided in turn with a series of barriers and trees before

stopping, ejecting the driver and one of his young passengers.

3. 22300 block of Clay Road. The 20-year old driver of a Chevrolet Camaro was killed in a street racing crash at this location in 2021. Witnesses said the driver was traveling at a high rate of speed and drove underneath the trailer of an 18-wheeler.

4. Intersection of Fry Road and Katy Freeway. A male pedestrian was killed while he crossed traffic to render aid to the driver of a pickup truck who struck a tree after being clipped by another truck simultaneously involved in a street race in 2021. The man who struck the pedestrian stayed at the scene and cooperated with the police investigation.

5. 1800 block of Fry Road. A man driving a Honda Odyssey was killed while exiting a McDonald's parking lot when he was struck by an intoxicated teen driving a Hyundai Sonata in 2022. Police said the driver was pinned inside his vehicle.

Always avoid driving intoxicated, distracted or tired and stay alert as you approach an intersection, especially on roads where you and others must change lanes frequently. Use your signals, the proper turn lanes, and make sure intersections are clear before crossing. Never run a red light, and remember that a yellow light does not mean "speed up," but "take extra precaution."

October is a deadly month for pedestrians, says TxDOT

As fall brings less daylight, drivers are urged to "Be Safe — Drive Smart"

AUSTIN — Fall and winter months bring shorter days and less light, making it harder for drivers to see—and safely avoid—pedestrians. October saw the highest number of pedestrian crashes in 2022. That's why TxDOT is using National Pedestrian Safety Month to launch its "Be Safe. Drive Smart" campaign and remind Texans that pedestrians are the most vulnerable road users.

When he was 6 years old, Misael Rico was walking to school with his mother when a distracted driver crashed into them, dragging him underneath the car. That night, doctors told his parents he might never walk or talk again. After countless surgeries and years of physical therapy, Rico started college this year, and joins TxDOT to urge drivers to pay attention and watch for people walking.

Only 1% of crashes in Texas involve pedestrians, yet they make up 19% of all traffic deaths. In the last five years, pedestrian traffic fatalities in Texas increased 29.6%, reflecting nationwide trends. In 2022, 5,764 traffic crashes involving pedestrians occurred in Texas, resulting in 829 deaths and 1,526 serious injuries.

"As we shift to fewer hours of daylight, it's up to drivers and pedestrians to adapt and help keep our roads safe," said TxDOT Executive Director Marc Williams. "Motorists need to stay alert and look for people walking, and pedestrians can take measures to be seen by drivers who may be inattentive behind the wheel."

TxDOT's campaign includes TV and radio spots, billboards and digital advertising. TxDOT will also bring more than 30 walking billboards—street teams wearing sandwich boards—to towns that saw the highest numbers of fatalities from pedestrian-related traffic crashes. The street teams will be deployed to put pedestrian safety messages front and center in places where vehicles and pedestrians share the road.

TxDOT encourages everyone to follow these safety tips to prevent a deadly encounter:

For drivers:

- Stop and yield for pedestrians in crosswalks.
- When turning, yield the right of way to pedestrians.
- Be cautious when passing stopped buses or other vehicles that can block your view of pedestrians.
- Pay attention and put your phone away.
- Follow the posted speed limit and drive to conditions.

Sheriff's Office urges vigilance amidst rise in automobile-pedestrian incidents

Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office urges both drivers and pedestrians to exercise caution in response to an increase in auto-pedestrian incidents.

In Fort Bend County, Texas crash records for 2023 indicate the number of accidents involving motor vehicles and pedestrians has more than doubled, increasing from 14 incidents in August to 27 in September. This is a significant fourfold increase compared to the 6 incidents reported in July.

Similarly, crashes involving motor vehicles and pedalcyclists have seen an uptick. In July, two such incidents were reported, while September saw a surge to 12. In August, three auto-to-pedalcyclist crashes were reported in Fort Bend County.

In response to the increase, the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office urges all road users to play their part in reducing these incidents on Texas roadways. Drivers are especially urged to exercise heightened vigilance in areas that witness heavy foot traffic from children.

For people walking:

- Cross the street only at intersections and crosswalks. Look left, right, then left again before crossing.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing. Don't assume traffic will stop for you.
- Follow all traffic and crosswalk signals.
- When walking, put away electronic devices that take your eyes and ears off the road.
- Stay visible. Wear reflective materials or use a flashlight at night.

TxDOT's "Be Safe. Drive Smart" pedestrian safety campaign is a key component of #EndTheStreakTX, a broader social media and word-of-mouth effort that encourages drivers to make safer choices while behind the wheel to help end the streak of daily deaths. Nov. 7, 2000, was the last deathless day on Texas roadways.

The Jordan defense also stepped up in the win, turning Cinco Ranch over twice on drives that could have reached the endzone.

Seven Lakes comes off a loss where they had a very strong second half but couldn't overcome what was a poor first half against Mayde Creek. The Spartans put up 24 points in the second half but struggled defensively against the Rams, allowing 181 yards on the ground and 110 yards through the air in the loss.

Jordan's key will be stopping the Seven Lakes run game and continuing to be opportunistic on defense, while doing the same thing they've done on offense all season. Seven Lakes will have to get some explosive plays offensively and move the ball on the air as well as the ground, while they will also need to limit big plays by the Jordan offense.







Cinco had the answer after that, as Marcus Gadlin ran in a 73-yard touchdown on the first play of the next drive, but Jordan added a third touchdown of the first quarter on a deep 50-yard pass from Willets to Andrew Marsh. 



Section 7. Conduct of Election. The Election shall be conducted by the Election Administrator and other election officers, including the precinct judges and alternate judges or clerks appointed by the Board, in accordance with the Election Agreements, Education Code, the Election Code and the Constitution and laws of the State and the United States of America. The President of the Board, the Superintendent, and their respective designees, are authorized to enter into, execute and deliver one or more Election Agreements, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Election Code. The terms and provisions of each Election Agreement are hereby incorporated into this Election Order. To the extent of any conflict between this Election Order and an Election Agreement, the terms and provisions of the Election Agreement shall prevail, and the President of the Board, the Superintendent, and their respective designees, are authorized to make such corrections, changes, revisions and modifications to this Election Order, including the exhibits hereto, as are deemed necessary or appropriate to conform to the Election Agreement, to comply with applicable state and federal law and to carry out the intent of the Board, as evidenced by this Election Order. The Administrator shall be responsible for establishing the central counting station for the ballots cast in the Election and appointing the personnel necessary for such station.

Section 8. Multilingual Election Material. For Waller and Fort Bend Counties, all notices, instructions, and ballots pertaining to the Election shall be furnished to voters in both English and Spanish and persons capable of acting as translators in both English and Spanish shall be made available to assist Spanish language speaking voters in understanding and participating in the election process. For Harris County, all notices, instructions, and ballots pertaining to the Election shall be furnished to voters in English, Spanish, Vietnamese and Chinese, and persons capable of acting as translators in English, Spanish, Vietnamese and Chinese shall be made available to assist such language speaking voters in understanding and participating in the election process.

Section 9. Delivery of Voted Ballots; Counting; Tabulation; Canvassing of Returns; Declaring Results. The ballots shall be counted by one or more teams of election officers assigned by the presiding judges, each team to consist of two or more election officers. After completion of his responsibilities under the Election Code, including the counting of the voted ballots and the tabulation of the results, the presiding judge shall make a written return of the Election results to the District in accordance with the Election Code. The Board shall canvass the returns and declare the results of the Election.

If a majority of the resident, qualified electors of the District voting at the Election, including those voting early, shall vote in favor of a Proposition, then the issuance and sale of the bonds described in such Proposition shall be authorized in the maximum amount contained therein, and the bonds shall be issued and sold at the price or prices and in such denominations determined by the Board to be in the District's best interest.

Section 10. Training of Election Officials. Pursuant to the Election Code, a public school of instruction for all election officers and clerks may be held as arranged or contracted by the Election Administrator.

Section 11. Notice of Election; Voter Information Document. Notice of the Election shall be given in the manner required by the Election Code and other applicable law. A voter information document for each Proposition in the form attached hereto as Exhibit C is hereby approved, together with such revisions as may be approved by the Superintendent or her designee, and shall be posted as and if required by law. To the extent required by law, each notice of the Election shall include the District's internet website address, which is <https://www.katyisd.org>.

Section 12. Notice of Meeting. The Board officially finds, determines, recites and declares that written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of the meeting at which this Election Order is adopted was posted on a bulletin board located at a place convenient to the public at the District's administrative offices for a least seventy-two (72) hours preceding the scheduled time of the meeting; that a telephonic or telegraphic notice of such meeting was given to all news media who have consented to pay any and all expenses incurred by the District in connection with providing such notice, both as required by the Open Meetings Law, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended; and that such meeting was open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Election Order and the subject matter thereof was discussed, considered and formally acted upon.

Section 13. Mandatory Statement of Information.

(a) Pursuant to Section 3.009, Texas Election Code: (i) the proposition language that will appear on the ballot is set forth in Section 4 of this Election Order. (ii) the purposes for which the bonds are to be authorized are set forth in Section 3 of this Election Order, (iii) the principal amount of bonds to be authorized is set forth in Section 3 of this Election Order, (iv) if the issuance of bonds is authorized by voters, taxes sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the costs of any credit agreements may be imposed, as set forth in Section 3 of this Election Order, (v) bonds authorized pursuant to this Election Order may be issued to mature over a specified number of years not to exceed the maximum number of years authorized by law and bearing interest at the rate or rates (not to exceed 15%), as authorized by law and determined by the Board, (vi) as of the date of the adoption of this Election Order, the aggregate amount of outstanding principal of the District's debt obligations is \$2,273,301,459.50, and the aggregate amount of outstanding interest on the District's debt obligations is \$1,327,500,633.17 (based upon the District's expectations relative to its variable rate debt obligations), and (vii) the District's ad valorem debt service tax rate as of the date of adoption of this Election Order is \$0.39 per \$100 valuation of taxable property.

(b) Based upon market conditions as of the date of this Election Order, the maximum net effective interest rate for any series of the bonds is estimated to be 4.25%. Such estimated maximum interest rate is provided as a matter of information, but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds, or any series thereof, may be sold. In addition, the estimate contained in this subsection (b) is (i) based on certain assumptions (including assumptions concerning prevailing market and economic conditions at the time(s) of issuance of the bonds) and derived from projections obtained from the District's financial advisor, (ii) subject to change to the extent that actual facts, circumstances and conditions prevailing at the time that the bonds are issued differ from such assumptions and projections, (iii) provided solely in satisfaction of the requirements of Section 3.009, Texas Election Code, and for no other purpose, without any assurance that such projections will be realized, and (iv) not intended to and does not give rise to a contract with voters or limit the authority of the Board to issue bonds in accordance with the Propositions submitted by this Election Order.

Section 14. Authority of the Superintendent. The Superintendent shall have the authority to take, or cause to be taken, all reasonable or necessary actions to ensure that the Election is fairly held and returns properly counted and tabulated for canvass by the Board, which actions are hereby ratified and confirmed. Without limiting the generality of the immediately preceding sentence, the Superintendent and his designees are hereby authorized to complete and update, as necessary, the exhibits hereto with the necessary information as same is made available to the District.

Section 15. Authorization to Execute. The President or Vice President of the Board is authorized to execute and the Secretary of the Board is authorized to attest this Election Order on behalf of the Board; and the President or Vice President of the Board is authorized to do all other things legal and necessary in connection with the holding and consummation of the Election.

Section 16. Effective Date. This Election Order is effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

鑑於，依照 Texas 州教育法第 45 章的規定，Katy 獨立學區（下稱「本區」）理事會（下稱「理事會」）有權發行債券；以及

鑑於，理事會已認定，召開並舉行選舉以獲選民授權發行上述債券是必要且適宜的；以及

鑑於，本區有意根據 Texas 州（下稱「本州」）的法律和適用的聯邦法律，通過各縣選舉行政官（下稱或「選舉行政官」），與 Texas 州 Harris 縣（下稱「Harris 縣」）、Texas 州 Fort Bend 縣（下稱「Fort Bend 縣」）和 Texas 州 Waller 縣（下稱「Waller 縣」）以及 Harris 縣和 Waller 縣的聯合（下稱「各縣」）簽訂一項或多項選舉協議（下稱「選舉協議」）。

故此，KATY 獨立學區理事會現命令如下：

Section 1. 選舉的召集、日期、合資格選民、以及時間。選舉（下稱「選舉」）應於 2023 年 11 月 7 日（下稱「選舉日」）在本區範圍內舉行，即自本命令（「選舉命令」）獲採納后的第七十八（78）天或以後，本區內的所有合資格居民選民均可以參加投票。理事會認為該選舉日期符合公眾利益。投票所應於選舉日當天上午 7:00 至晚上 7:00 間開放。

Section 2. 投票區、投票所、選舉行政官和官員。除本通知另有規定外，特此將全部或部分位於本區地域邊界內的各縣選舉投票區的邊界及區域指定為本區用於本次選舉的投票區，並指定本區選舉投票區的投票區編號應為每個投票區對應的縣投票區編號。選舉日投票所應如本選舉命令附件 A 中所示。應依照 Texas 州選舉法（下稱「選舉法」）任命本次選舉的投票區法官及候補法官。

學區總監或其指定人員可隨時認定（a）此後指定的投票所無法使用或不適合選舉用途或將此類投票所遷移至他處符合本區人民的最佳利益；或者（b）此後指定的某首席法官或後補首席法官不再符合任職資格或無法繼續任職。學區總監現獲准可在出現上述情況時以書面形式更換投票所或指定並委任首席法官或後補首席法官，並更正或修改本選舉命令的附件，並發出符合選舉法規定的、被視為充分的上述通知。

Section 3. 提案。以下提案（下稱「提案」）應在選舉中呈交本區之合資格居民選民：

是否授權 KATY 獨立學區（下稱「本區」）理事會（下稱「理事會」）按照 TEXAS 州憲法與法律以及美國憲法與法律，發行金額為 722,992,054 美元的本區債券，用於設計、建造、收購、修復、翻新、擴建、改善本區新建和現有學校大樓並配備設備（包括此類學校大樓的安全和安保基礎設施），購置新建學校大樓所必需的土地及購置新校車，該債券可透過不同系列或批次發行，按系列到期，其利率、發行價格及銷售價格應以發行時的法規為準；且是否授權理事會按照上述法律，不限稅率或稅額，對本區所有可徵稅房產徵收充足的年度從價稅，以償付上述債券本息及所有信貸協議（包括針對債券、與債券有關或與債券相關而簽發或授權的信貸協議）的費用？

KATY 獨立學區 - 提案 B

KATY 獨立學區 - 提案 D

[] 贊成) KATY 獨立學區發行金額為 29,875,472 美元的學校建設債券，用於維修和更換運動場設施，包括但不限於操場跑道維修和重新鋪設道面、照明、屋頂和看台，並課徵足夠的稅款以支付債券的本金及利息。房產稅有所增加。

[] 反對)

Section 5. 投票。選舉日舉行或執行選舉時可使用電子投票機；然而，若使用該等電子投票機不可行，則可通過使用紙質選票來執行選舉（本節另有規定的情況除外）。電子投票機或紙質選票可用於親自出席提前投票（本節另有規定的情況除外）。根據選舉法規定，本區應在本選舉所用之各投票所提供的至少一個無障礙投票系統。該提前投票系統應符合就允許肢體殘障選民投出無記名投票之投票系統作出規定的 Texas 州與聯邦法律。紙質選票可用於以郵寄方式進行的提前投票。

選民如欲支持某提案，應在選票上該提案填劃「贊同」；如欲反對某提案，請為其填劃「反對」。投票應按照選舉法進行。

Section 6. 提前投票。理事會特此任命選舉行政官為本區的常規提前投票書記官。無論以親自出席還是郵寄方式參加提前投票，都必需遵守選舉法。

現授權並指示選舉行政官為舉行提前投票而指定所需的提前投票選票委員會和其他官員。

如果通過傳真或電子郵件將郵遞選票申請發送至各縣，仍須在第四個工作日之前將原件郵寄至上述郵寄地址。所有提前投票和選舉日投票地點都可能由各縣變更。各縣提前投票和選舉日投票地點完整列表可在以下網站在線查詢：Harris 縣 - harrisvotes.com；Fort Bend 縣 - fortbendcountytx.gov；Waller 縣 - co.waller.tx.us。

Section 7. 執行選舉。本選舉應由選舉行政官和其他選舉官員依據選舉協議、教育法、選舉法以及美國與 Texas 州憲法和法律執行，這些官員包括理事會所委任的投票區法官、後補法官或書記官。根據選舉法的相關規定，理事會主席、學區總監及其各自指定人員有權訂立、簽署和交付一項或多項選舉協議。各選舉協議的條款和規定特此納入本選舉命令。如果本選舉命令與選舉協議之間存在任何衝突，則以選舉協議的條款和規定為準，並授權理事會主席、學區總監及其各自的指定人員對本選舉命令（包括本選舉命令的附件）作出必要或適宜之更正、更改、修訂和修改，以符合選舉協議，遵守適用的州和聯邦法律，並貫徹本選舉命令所體現之理事會的意圖。行政官還應負責建立中央計票站以統計上述選舉中的投票，並任命計票站工作人員。

Section 8. 多語言選舉材料。就 Waller 和 Fort Bend 縣而言，與選舉有關的所有通知、指示和選票應以英語和西班牙語提供給選民，並且應有英語和西班牙語翻譯人員在場，協助說西班牙語的選民理解及參與選舉過程。就 Harris 縣而言，與選舉有關的所有通知、指示和選票應以英語、西班牙語、越南語和中文提供給選民，並且應有英語、西班牙語、越南語和中文翻譯人員在場，協助說上述語言的選民理解及參與選舉過程。

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Section 9. 選交已投選票：計票，統計；審驗選票報告：宣佈結果。選票應由首席法官指派的一個或多個選舉官員小組計票，每個小組由兩名或兩名以上選舉官員組成完成選舉法規定的職責，包括點算已投選票並統計結果後，首席法官應依照選舉法編寫書面的選舉結果報告並呈交本區。理事會應審核選票報告並宣布選舉結果。

在選舉中投票的本區合資格居民選民（包括提前投票的選民）中，若多數投票支持提案則提案中所述的債券發行和銷售應以其中註明的最高金額得以授權，並且債券發行及銷售的價格及面額應由理事會出於本區最佳利益而釐定。

Section 10. 選舉官員培訓。根據選舉法的規定，選舉行政官可安排或簽約一處公立學校對所有選舉官員及書記官進行指導。

Section 11. 選舉通知：選民信息文件。選舉通知應以選舉法和其他適用法律規定的方式發出。特此批准各個提案的選民信息文件（其形式如附件 C 所示），以及學區總監或其指定人員可能批准的此類修改，並應依法予以張貼。在法律規定的範圍內，每份選舉通知皆應包括本區的互聯網網站地址，即 <https://www.katyisd.org>。

Section 12. 會議通知。理事會正式認定、決定、宣讀並宣佈：已將採納本選舉命令之會議的日期、時間、地點和主題的書面通知張貼在便於本區公眾查閱的公告板上，張貼時間為預定會議時間的至少七十二(72)小時之前；已將上述會議的電話或電報通知提交給同意支付本區因提供上述通知而承擔的所有費用的所有新聞媒體，上述兩項行動均依照公開會議法、Texas 州政府法（修訂版）第 551 章之規定進行；上述會議已依法全程向公眾公開，並且本選舉命令及會議主題已經過討論、商議及正式執行。

Section 13. 信息強制性聲明。

(a) 根據 Texas 州選舉法第 3.009 節：(i) 載於選票之提案條文如本選舉命令第 4 節所述，(ii) 擬授權發行債券之目的如本選舉命令第 3 節所述，(iii) 擬授權發行債券之本金如本選舉命令第 3 節所述，(iv) 若債券發行獲選民授權，則可徵收充足的稅款（無稅率或稅額限制），以償付債券的本息以及任何信貸協議的費用，如本選舉命令第 3 節所述，(v) 依據本選舉命令授權發行的債券可在特定年數後到期，但不得超過 40 年或法律授權的最長年限；債券的利率由理事會決定，經過法律授權，但不超過 15%，(vi) 截至本選舉命令被採納之日，本區債務的未償還本金總額為 2,273,301,459.50 美元，本區債務的未償還利息總額為 1,327,500,633.17 美元（基於本區對其可變利率債券債務的預期），以及 (vii) 截至本選舉命令被採納之日，本區的從債債務清償稅率為每 100 美元可徵稅房產收稅 0.39 美元。

(b) 根據本選舉命令採納之日的債券市場情況，該債券的任何系列的最大淨實際利率估計為 4.25%。該估計的最大利率基於信息目的提供，並未限定債券或任何系列的債券出售時的利率。此外，本子節(b)包含的預估數字系：(i) 基於一定的假設（包括對發行債券時的普遍市場和經濟狀況所做的假設）並根據本區財務顧問的預測得出，(ii) 若債券發行時，普遍的實際事實、情況和條件不同於上述假設和預測，則上述預估數字可能有變動，(iii) 僅為滿足 Texas 州選舉法第 3.009 節的要求而提供，不得用於其他用途，亦不保證上述預測能否實現，及 (iv) 無意且不構成與選民簽訂合約或限制理事會依照本選舉命令之提案而發行債券的權力。

Section 14. 學區總監的職權。學區總監有權採取或促使採取一切合理或必要的行動，以確保選舉公平舉行，並對選舉結果正確計票和統計供理事會進行審核，特此批准和確認這些行動。在不限制前述語句的一般性的情況下，特此授權學區總監及其指定人員在必要時完成和更新本文件隨附的附件，其中包含的必要信息與提供給本區的一致。

Section 15. 授權簽署。理事會主席或副主席已獲得簽署本選舉命令的授權，且理事會秘書長已獲得代表理事會見證本選舉命令的授權；且理事會主席或副主席已獲得授權，可執行與完成選舉相關的其他所有合法且必要的事務。

Section 16. 生效日期。本選舉命令經通過和批准後立即生效。

XÉT THẤY RẰNG, Ban Quản Trị ("Ban Quản Trị") của Học Khu Độc Lập Katy ("Học Khu") có quyền phát hành các trái phiếu theo quy định của Chương 45, Bộ Luật Giáo Dục Texas; và

VÌ VẬY, BÂY GIỜ, BAN QUẢN TRỊ HỌC KHU ĐỘC LẬP KATY RA LỆNH:

Section 1. Yêu Cầu Tổ Chức Bầu Cử; Ngày; Các Củ Tri Hội Đủ Điều Kiện; và Giờ. Một cuộc bầu cử ("Cuộc Bầu Cử") sẽ được tổ chức vào ngày 7 tháng Mười Một, 2023 ("Ngày Bầu Cử"), có nghĩa là tối thiểu bảy mươi tám (78) ngày kể từ ngày thông qua lệnh này ("Lệnh Bầu Cử"), trong phạm vi và trên toàn bộ ranh giới của Học Khu, trong đó tất cả các cù tri cù dân hội đủ điều kiện của Học Khu sẽ được quyền bỏ phiếu. Theo đây Ban Quản Trị thấy rằng việc tổ chức Cuộc Bầu Cử này vào ngày đó là vì lợi ích công cộng. Giờ mở cửa các địa điểm bỏ phiếu vào Ngày Bầu Cử sẽ là từ 7 giờ sáng đến 7 giờ tối.

Section 2. Các Phân Khu Bầu Cử; Các Phòng Phiếu; Quản Trí Viên Bầu Cử và Các Viên Chức. Ngoại trừ những trường hợp có thể được quy định khác trong tài liệu này, ranh giới và lãnh thổ của các phân khu bầu cử của các Quản hoán toàn hoặc một phần năm trong ranh giới lãnh thổ của Học Khu theo đây được chỉ định là các phân khu bỏ phiếu của Khu vực bầu cử và số phân khu cho các phân khu bầu cử của Học Khu sẽ là số phân khu Quản tương ứng của mỗi phân khu. Các phân khu Bầu Cử trong Ngày Bầu Cử sẽ được trình bày trên Phụ Lục A của Lệnh Bầu Cử này. Các trường ban đầu hành và trường ban đầu hành dự khuyễn cho Cuộc Bầu Cử sẽ được bổ nhiệm theo Bộ Luật Bầu Cử Texas ("Bộ Luật Bầu Cử").
