ary campuses, effective for the 2024-2025 school year. The decision has not been announced publicly but came to light in social media posts at the end of March, as campus leaders informed existing ICs of this decision on March 21

of instructional coordinators in the district According to emails obtained by the Katy Times, the number of instructional coordinators at each secondary campus is being reduced from four positions to
two, due to budget constraints. The job two, due to budget constraints. The job
description for the remaining IC's is being modified to change the program model from "content-specific" to "instructional non-content specific." The two IC's remain
