

## KACC, **KBA** unite for second 'Women of Katy' event

A sold-out crowd packed Theater 6 at Alamo Drafthouse on March 28th, as women entrepreneurs, business owners and corporate executives gathered for the second "Women of Katy" event put on by the Katy Area Chamber of Commerce and the Katy Business Association. This event, in a symposium format, was held from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the venue at 2707 Commercial Center Blvd Suite K-100, in Katy.

'The goal of this program is to provide real-time resources that you can put into action today," said Katy Area Chamber Vice President of Business Development Stacy Jacobs as she welcomed participants.

After sponsor introductions from KBA President Olivia Martin, the program kicked off with a presentation from Elizabeth Westbrook, a licensed social worker and psychotherapist who works at Here Comes the Sun Counseling in Katy, who advised attendees on "How to Go from Chaos to Calm." Westbrook estimated that about 50 per cent of women struggle with stress; she addressed the challenges faced not only by "single

## **KISD** responds to reducing instructional coach positions

Katy ISD is reducing the number of instructional coaches at the district's secondary campuses, effective for the 2024-2025 school year. The decision has not been announced publicly but came to light in social media posts at the end of March, as campus leaders informed existing ICs of this decision on March 21.

Also during the public comment session at the March 25 KISD board meeting, Amy McConnell — a teacher at Cinco Ranch High School — implored the board to reconsider the decision to reduce the number of instructional coordinators in the district.

According to emails obtained by the Katy Times, the number of instructional coordinators at each secondary campus is being reduced from four positions to two, due to budget constraints. The job

description for the remaining IC's is being modified to change the program model from "content-specific" to "instructional non-content specific." The two IC's remaining at secondary campuses will "provide classroom support on instruction/classroom management" and assist all teachers and teams with instructional strategies, per



Family YMCA, 7850 Howell Sugar Land Rd, Houston.

Through this initiative, Precinct 4 will build approximately 50 miles of sidewalks.

The program will create safer paths to schools, efficient routes to hospitals and healthcare providers, walkable shopping destinations, connected parks, and solidify routes where natural footpaths already exist. It will also expand job opportunities by safely connecting residents to bus stops and over 130 businesses.

One project is underway in the Katy area on Mayde Creek along Greenhouse Road and Saums Road. It will add connections to Mayde Park, a church, and Mayde Schools along Saums Road and Greenhouse Road on the south.

Phase 1 of the initiative is projected to be completed by 2025.

The projects were identified by Precinct 4 through a data-driven analysis and from residents at various community engagement events.

The emails further state that the existing IC's will be employed in the district "in some capacity" and that the move would reduce the number of teaching positions available in the district.

The district's secondary campuses include ten high schools and 18 junior high schools, including the two new campuses opening in 2024-2025 - Freeman High School and Nelson Junior High.

The district also employs "instructional coordinators" - a position that is often confused with the "instructional coach" job but the coordinator positions are unaffected by the staffing changes, said the district in an email to the Katy Times.

After McConnell's comments were referenced in a March 28 Katy Times article about the school board meeting, the district responded directly to the newspaper with an emailed statement.

'The state has not funded public schools' basic allotment per child since 2019," said Nick Petito, KISD's general manager for media relations in an email to the Katy Times.

"Insufficient funding from the state is requiring districts like Katy to make challenging budget decisions that include strategically modifying some program models while prioritizing the retention of all of our teachers and staff within the district."

"The instructional coach (IC) model will be restructured next school year in a manner that continues to support the needs of all classroom teachers," continued Petito. "Some current ICs will remain in an IC role, while others will transition into other necessary teaching and learning capacities across campuses and district, be that as a classroom teacher or other instructional support position. Departments and campus administrations began communicating this transition to affected staff earlier this month."

The district continues to review program models to ensure every teacher receives the needed professional support, and schools remain in the position to deliver high quality educational experiences across every classroom," Petito concluded.



## Patti's Patch pocket park to open April 13

A variety of native Texas prairie grasses, wildflowers seeds, and 150 bluebonnet plants will make their debut in a new pocket prairie opening at Willow Fork Park this spring. In memory of Patti Rae Porter Hopper, WFDD's legal assistant for more than 20 years.

## Cougar Textbook Access Program saving money, time for UH students

It's no secret that textbooks are one of the unforeseen costs contributing to student debt. Nationwide, university students pay approximately \$1,200 annually for the books they need. Add that to tuition, fees, cost of living and other expenses, and they face another financial hurdle on their academic journeys.

The University of Houston, however, has been taking the guesswork out of budgeting for textbooks. Through the Cougar Textbook Access Program (CTAP), UH provides all undergraduate students with the books they need for a flat fee-\$299 for fall and spring and \$180 for summer. Texts and materials are available digitally or via hard copies available in the UH Bookstore.

CTAP has proven convenient for students, but more importantly, it's proven to be a major cost cutting initiative. During this academic year, the program has saved UH students more than \$10

million on their textbooks. "CTAP has removed

inconveniences that come with the use of virtual textbooks and has allowed me to focus more on learning, said Christian Avalos, a student in UH's C. T. Bauer College of Business.

Aside from savings the program allows UH students to focus on what's important—their classes.

A breakdown of savings across the UH System (UH-Clear Lake, UH-Downtown, UH-Victoria) from Fall 2023 through Spring 2024 is as follows:

\$10,250,000 UHCL \$47,000 UHD \$163,000 UHV \$212,000 Total \$10,672,000

"A student once told me that because of costs, they were sometimes forced to wait two weeks into the semester before they could purchase their course materials. CTAP ensures our students don't have to wait for their books. We want to make sure all students start ready to learn," said Emily Messa, UH senior associate vice president for adminis-





## **Tompkins falls to Northbrook** in thrilling penalty shootout

It was neck and neck all night between Tompkins and Northbrook.

The Falcons knew they were in for a tough match against the District 17-6A winners in the second round of the playoffs, but Tompkins was up for the challenge. The Falcons took Northbrook on to the very end, ending full time in a 1-1, but in the end Northbrook came out on top, winning a penalty shootout 7-6 over the Falcons.

"It was an unbelievable effort tonight," said Tompkins head coach Tom Jones. "We started out with a couple guys injured and then we had some guys go down tonight as well, but everyone who went in stepped up. They fought all night — there was 100 minutes played and they were limping, they're pushing, and they did everything they can. They should keep their heads up because they left everything on the field tonight."

It was a hard fought game and neither team could break the deadlock in the first half. Northbrook came out wanting to possess the ball and Tompkins was happy to let them do it, with the Falcons breaking on the counter to create chances. Northbrook broke the tie just a minute into the second half. Anthony Ayala got past the Tompkins defense and slipped it into the back of the net.

Tompkins pushed for the tying goal all second half and almost had it multiple times. But even with misses they weren't deterred and in the 74th minute, the Falcons found the equalizer as Braden Lehner was able to head a corner into the near post corner and tie the game.

"The defense was huge for us today and really helped keep us in the game," Jones said. "They kept everything in front of them, did

everything we asked them to do and grinded it out. Everyone gave everything they had."

The game went into extra time and both teams continuing to create chances, but neither could find the game winner, with the game ultimately going to penalties and both teams takers did well. Tompkins missed its second penalty and Northbrook missed its fourth. Both teams' penalty makers made the next three, and Tompkins missed its ninth attempt before Northbrook was able to sneak its last penalty past the Tompkins keeper and into the net, as the Falcons were not able to keep the shootout going.

"We knew what they were going to try and come out and do and we wanted to counter off that and we created chances doing it," Jones said. "We did a decent job of it, but of course could have done some things better. But in the end, both of the teams played really well and it came down to a bit of luck — it just sadly didn't go our way."

This was a strong senior class for the Falcons that got them back to the area round after a two year absence, but Tompkins will also bring back lots of talented underclassman and they hope to build on this strong year.

"It started all the way last year at the end of the season," Jones said. "They all took on the responsibility and they led the way to this. They had a great season and there's 19 of them and I can't say enough about them. They're an amazing group of men that is going to do some amazing things.

came out for the second half. Seven Lakes created chances left and right to start the half and it paid off in the 54th minute, when the Spartans earned a free kick from 32-yards out. Aiden Morrison stepped up and lifted a dangerous ball into the area that went over the keepers head and into the back of the net to tie things

"It was hard because we felt like we were dominating the whole game, but that's soccer sometimes — they got one shot and made a goal out of it," Morrison said. "I was just glad we kept our composure and we trusted ourselves because we knew we would find a way to tie it up eventually."

Seven Lakes kept pouring the pressure on but Jordan answered back with counters. Neither could get a ball in the back of the net for the rest of regulation or in extra time despite the chances and it set up the penalty shootout.
