New area code proposed for Greater Houston area

PUCT accepting public comments on proposal until Aug. 5

Austin, Texas - The Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUCT) is accepting public comments on a petition by the North American Number Planning Administrator (NANPA) for the addition of a new area code to accommodate continuing growth in the greater Houston area. Comments must be submitted by Aug. 5.

NANPA projects the four existing area codes (281/346/713/832) will run out of numbers by the third quarter of 2025.

The new area code would overlay existing area codes, which currently serve the greater metropolitan area of the City of Houston and smaller cities including Alvin, Baytown, Cleveland, Cypress, Dickinson, Friendswood, Humble, Katy, Kemah, League City, Richmond,

And to close out the 2023 Fort Bend County Fair, the legendary music group and ten-time Grammy winner, Asleep at the Wheel, will take the stage on Sunday, October 8. Since 1970, the band has been a staple in Western swing and honkytonk country. Ray Benson is the founder and heartbeat of the iconic band. Through the years, they have continued to grow their fan base reaching all generations.

The Fort Bend County Fair Association is on a mission to help youth achieve their educational goals. The Fair in 2022 provided over \$1.4 million in generated revenue through their four auctions (jr livestock, art, freezer, and heifer replacement) and scholarship program. During the fair's run, there will be 11 livestock shows with over 500 exhibitors.

The Fort Bend County Fair and Rodeo runs from September 29 to October 8. BBQ cookoff weekend is the weekend prior, running from September 22 -23. All concerts are included in the ticket price and are on sale at fortbendcountyfair.com.

As Katy ISD prepared to observe Energy Savings Week (July 3-7) across its 98 campuses and facilities, it was honored with the Best in Class: Energy Efficiency Plus Health recognition from the United States Department of Education, U.S. Department of Energy and the Environmental Protection Agency. GROTON, Conn. - Submariners make up only 10 percent of the U.S. Navy's personnel, but they play a critical role in carrying out one of the Defense Department's most important missions: strategic deterrence. Petty Officer 3rd Class Lorenzo Zabala, a native of Katy, Texas, is one of the sailors continuing a 123-year tradition of service under the sea to help ensure Americans' safety.

Zabala joined the Navy two years ago and today serves as a sonar technician aboard USS Indiana.

"I joined the Navy because I felt stuck in my situation at home," said Zabala. "I finally decided to take a step out of my comfort zone and do something I have always wanted to do."

Growing up in Katy, Zabala attended Katy High School and graduated in 2017.

Skills and values similar to those found in Katy are similar to those required to succeed in the military.

"I grew up in a big football town and was on the team all four years of high school," said Zabala. "Through that, I learned the importance of teamwork and hard work. I was always taught that I have to work to be the best. My dad was the same way and he also taught me that we have to work hard to provide for our family. Teamwork is important because you

conducting rapid defensive and offensive operations around the world, in furtherance of U.S. national security.

There are three basic types of submarines: fast-attack submarines (SSN), ballistic-missile submarines (SSBN) and guided-missile submarines (SSGN).

Fast-attack submarines are designed to hunt down and destroy enemy submarines and surface ships; strike targets ashore with cruise missiles; carry and deliver Navy SEALs; conduct intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance missions; and engage in mine warfare. The Virginia-class SSN is the most advanced submarine in the world today. It combines stealth and payload capability to meet Combatant Commanders' demands in this era of strategic competition.

The Navy's ballistic-missile submarines, often referred to as "boomers," tinuous sea-based strategic deterrence into the 2080s.

Guided-missile submarines provide the Navy with unprecedented strike and special operation mission capabilities from a clandestine platform. Each SSGN is capable of carrying 154 Tomahawk cruise missiles, plus a complement of heavyweight torpedoes to be fired through four torpedo tubes.

"Our mission remains timeless - to provide our fellow citizens with nothing less than the very best Navy: fully combat ready at all times, focused on warfighting excellence, and committed to superior leadership at every single level," said Adm. Mike Gilday, Chief of Naval Operations. "This is our calling. And I cannot imagine a calling more worthy."

Strategic deterrence is the nation's ultimate insurance program, according to Navy officials. As a member of the submarine force, Zabala is part of a rich history of the U.S. Navy's most versatile weapons platform, capable of taking the fight to the enemy in defense of America and its allies.

"The Navy contributes to national defense by conducting strategic deterrence operations," said Zabala. "Our presence alone is enough to ensure adversaries don't take hostile aggression against us."

With 90 percent of global commerce traveling by sea and access to the internet relying on the security of undersea fiber optic cables, Navy officials continue to emphasize that the prosperity of the United States is directly linked to trained sailors and a strong Navy. Zabala and the sailors they serve with have many opportunities to achieve accomplishments during their military service. Zabala. "It makes me proud that I am able to support the boat and give flexibility to the watch bill. Qualifying also gives the person I am relieving the opportunity to move up, so they can qualify for the next watch."

As Zabala and other sailors continue to train and perform missions, they take pride in serving their country in the United States Navy.

"Serving in the Navy means being a part of something greater than yourself," said Zabala. "It also means making sacrifices that not everyone is willing to make. Someone has to make them though, so why not be that person? I know that my sacrifices benefit my family though, and are setting me up for a better future."

Zabala is grateful to others for helping make a Navy career possible.

"I want to thank Oscar Perezurrutia for guiding me when I got to the boat, and showing me how I can set myself apart from my peers," added Zabala. "I also want to thank Chief Deline, for guiding me and supporting me. He showed me what good leadership is."



Kenny's hiring is pending final approval from the University.

With 27 years of coaching experience, Kenny brings a wealth of knowledge to the Houston

Baseball program. Kenny has spent the last 14 seasons with Power 5 programs and tutored 45 pitchers selected in the MLB Draft. A former New York Mets draft pick, Kenny spent the previous seven seasons as the pitching coach at the University of Georgia.

"I am very excited to be joining Coach Whitting and the rest of the University of Houston Baseball staff," Kenny said. "They have proven

themselves as an outstanding program that wins on and off the field and I am excited to contribute to their success as they move to the Big 12 Conference.'

With the Bulldogs, Kenny made a dramatic impact with the program, helping Georgia to three NCAA Tournaments, including two as a national seed and consistent Top 25 rankings, alongside several school records. He also mentored 12 Georgia pitchers who were selected in the MLB Draft over the last five years including junior left-hander Jaden Woods who is projected as a premium pick in the upcoming 2023 draft.

A native of Ann Arbor, Mich., Kenny followed head coach Erik Bakich to the University of Michigan after three seasons at the University of Maryland. With the Wolverines, Kenny tutored 10 pitchers selected in the MLB Draft while his staff consistently ranked at the top of the Big Ten Conference in multiple categories, helping the program to two NCAA postseason appearances.

"Sean Kenny is a perfect fit for the University of Houston and the excellent program that Coach Whitting has built over the last decade," Bakich said. "Sean has developed professional pitchers and winning teams from coast to coast. His success and experience in California, the Big Ten, the ACC and SEC are the exact combination to help Cougar Baseball and their pitching staff win championships in the Big 12 for years to come. Sean is also a dynamic recruiter and a great person who will add tremendous value to this high-energy coaching staff. Congratulations to him and Marissa, as well as Coach Whitting and the UH Baseball Team and pitchers."

Bakich is currently the head coach of the Clemson University baseball team after serving as the head coach at Michigan and Maryland.

Under the direction of Kenny, Maryland's pitching staff set school records while also ranking near the top of the ACC standings. With the Terrapins,

he also served as the recruiting coordinator and produced a recruiting class in 2010 that was the program's first top-25 ranked recruiting class, while developing three MLB Draft picks.

Kenny spent six seasons as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at Pepperdine under Steve Rodriguez. He helped guide the Waves to five NCAA Regional appearances and three West Coast Conference (WCC) titles. He coached the 2005 WCC Pitcher of the Year and the 2005 WCC Freshman of the Year in Barry Enright who went on to be named the 2006 WCC Pitcher of the Year and eventually reached the Major Leagues with Arizona in 2010. During his tenure with the Waves, 12 pitchers were selected in the MLB Draft.

Before heading to Pepperdine, Kenny worked at the University of San Diego where he served as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator on Rich Hill's staff from 1999-2003. He helped USD to West Coast Conference titles in 2002 and 2003 and recruited the nation's 22nd-best class for 2004. One of his standout players was 2002 WCC Pitcher of the Year and Third Team All-American Ricky Barrett. A total of 12 Toreros including three pitchers were selected in the MLB Draft during his stint at San Diego.

Kenny began his coaching career as Volunteer Assistant at Saint Mary's College in Moraga, Calif., in 1997, working with the outfielders. He landed his first full-time coaching position at Laney Community College in Oakland, Calif., where he served as pitching coach in 1998.

Kenny is a graduate of Eastern Michigan where he earned All-Mid-American Conference honors as a pitcher for the Eagles. He was a 17th-round selection of the New York Mets in the 1993 MLB Draft and played three seasons of professional baseball. He earned a bachelor's¬ degree in literature from EMU in the fall of 1997 and a master's in physical education from Saint Mary's in 2000.

The year was headlined by Ananya Sriniketh for Tompkins, who made a run to the state final after winning the district and regional tennis title.


Ewing named golf coach of the year
